

Welcome to Cheyenne Sting Soccer!



Cheyenne Sting is organized to provide a competitive soccer experience, promoting the highest standards of youth athletics including player and team development and promote a higher level of fitness. Cheyenne Sting strives to cultivate a love for the game of soccer among players, coaches, parents, and other interested members of the community.

Tryouts are held in late spring. All players must tryout. Players are obligated to the team for both fall and spring seasons. The team coach and the Director of Coaching make the decision of player placement. This decision is final.

Players may play up only if grade appropriate. Exceptions can be made if necessary to complete a roster.

All Sting teams are encouraged to represent Cheyenne in the Wyoming State Cup. If a team chooses not to play in the Wyoming State Cup, they are required to play in at least one full-sided summer tournament. Sting will pay up to the cost of State Cup registration for one tournament per team per year.

Should a player have a concern, it should first be addressed with the Head Coach of the team. If the problem cannot be resolved, it is then addressed with the Director of Coaching. If there is still no resolution, the matter will be addressed by the Sting Committee, (Advanced Committee of Cheyenne Soccer Club), with recommendation to the Executive Committee of Cheyenne Soccer Club. The decision of the Executive Committee is final.

There is no guarantee of playing time. Coaches should attempt to insure each player plays in each half of each game, provided the player has been responsible in attending practices and games.

Players are to be responsible in attending all practices and games, and show up on time. Players need to be picked up promptly after practice. Our coaches are not babysitters. Coaches can not leave until all players have been picked up

Cheyenne Sting is a volunteer organization, all families are expected to contribute time to Cheyenne Sting. Each team is to designate a parent manager(s) to arrange uniform purchases, scheduling, rostering, etc. In addition, each team is to provide a parent volunteer to the Sting Committee to assist with projects and policies. Each team should have a treasurer. Each player's parent should have a job! We rely on volunteers to keep Sting and competitive soccer available to soccer players in Cheyenne. Players and parents are always welcome to attend meetings of Cheyenne Sting and Cheyenne

Soccer Club. We appreciate your suggestions and assistance. Be involved in a positive way.

Scholarships are available on a limited basis. To apply for a scholarship, contact the Registrar. Recipients of scholarships are asked to volunteer to help their team or the Sting Committee.

Refund Policy

- \$200 refund if a player does not play at all

- \$150 refund after first game

- No refund after second game
